Art Technique-

Aquatint is an intaglio print-making technique, a variant of etching that produces areas of tone rather than lines. For this reason it has mostly been used in conjunction with etching, to give both lines and shaded tone. It has also been used historically to print in color, both by printing with multiple plates in different colors, and by making monochrome prints that were then hand-colored with watercolor

Helane Freeman-Artist Demonstration (March 16th)

Drawing is Helane Freeman's forté; she is an illustrator at heart. A distinguished student, Helane graduated from Art Center College of Design with honors in Illustration. Her uncanny ability to turn paint, pencil and pixels into emotion, movement and perspective comes from her artistic lineage, traceable to Leonardo da Vinci via master/apprentice relationships. She has shared her lineage and inspired other artists by teaching anatomy figure drawing at the California Art Institute.

At the age of 14, Helane began selling her paintings, and her work soon adorned the walls of local banks and several neighborhood businesses. During her career as an illustrator and art director, Helane has worked on over 100 record album covers, including Frank Sinatra - Radio Years and NWA's Straight Outta Compton, named one of

the 25 best album covers of all time by Digital Arts Magazine. Helane has earned six RIAA Gold and Platinum Albums, a Hollywood Reporter Key Art Award for ad design for the film Dumb and Dumber, and numerous other awards and accolades.

Helane's flexibility is astounding. In addition to her own well-developed style, she can mimic some of the world's most famous artists, from Norman Rockwell to Roy Lichtenstein. Helane's drawings and paintings don't simply evoke other artist's styles; she's so accurate in her impressions, Disney's legal department once took three days to verify that her commissioned Jackson Pollock-style painting was an original work and not a direct copy of an actual Pollock piece!

Helane received the rare honor of having her work proudly displayed in the Smithsonian Institution as part of its Priority Records "The California Raisins" exhibit, now part of the museum's permanent collection. She has also been commissioned to draw many celebrity likenesses; her pictures of Charlie Sheen and Oprah Winfrey each received first-round approvals on the spot from Charlie and Oprah themselves!

Helane is adept at creating illustrations aross all forms of media, from traditional oil-on-canvas to airbrush to digital drawing on her state of the art Cintiq. No matter how large or small the job, Helane is always on time and on budget - with a smile!

I initially began with oil painting, then became 'hooked' on pastels, and have recently returned to oils with experimentation on oil paint atop acrylics.
