Artist of the Month

Char Jackowitcz

I moved to Simi Valley in 1969 to buy a home and raise a family. I was in the medical field for 30 years and spent 10 years as an administrative assistant for a consultant. I was always too busy for anything other than my job and family until I reached retirement.

I always admired people with an artistic ability to paint and draw. 30 years ago, I began to make a bucket list and every year I would review it. Upon reviewing the list from the previous year, I would cross off things I had done. Some years I would add more to the list, yet the last one on the list was painting and drawing. Always thinking it was never possible.

In my early retirement years, I spent most of my time doing volunteer work which also included Simi Senior Center. I had not received any training in drawing and painting until I was 73 years old. Once my volunteer commitments had been completed, I had more time to focus on other areas of interest. With the encouragement of my husband, I joined the Simi Senior Center drawing class. My husband saw that they had classes and convinced me to just try it.

It was in July of 2019 that I pursued drawing. I had so much fun on my first experience that I wanted more. My first drawing was of "my little chicken". Although it took a few tries, I was enjoying every minute. It was then that the passion began. I practiced every day.

Covid hit and I just kept drawing. My dear friend suggested taking the online classes at Mt Sac Adult College program. My love for painting was born. Nothing compared to the passion I felt when I put the paint brush in my hand for a watercolor. Just the sound of the brush on the paper and the sound of the stroke. I was captivated. Every painting is an adventure. I would look at a project, thinking that this is too hard for me and then take a deep breath and follow through. When completed, I couldn't believe that painting came from inside of me. It was so personal.

I want my children to have a part of me when I'm gone, that is really me. The part of me that comes from deep inside. That is the essence of the idea "follow your heart". I paint for the love and the enrichment of the journey. To me painting is more than the expression of skill. It is the drive I feel inside to learn more. For me in my life, it is all about the seeking.
